Similarly, according to the "2011 Catalyst Census of Women Executive Officers and Top Earners," which counts the number of women in upper management in Fortune 500 companies, women are 18.4% of executive officers in the finance and insurance industries. The Accounting & Financial Women's Alliance identifies this gap as a major problem in the accounting and finance industry that needs to be remedied.
